

1 Source of the Soča River

One of the finest and clearest karst sources in the Julian Alps bursts to the surface from a cave with an underground lake. There is a well-arranged and secure but nevertheless demanding hiking trail routed to the source.

2 Alpinum Juliana

This Alpine botanical garden is at its most beautiful in May and in the beginning of June when the primroses and gentians are in bloom. From early spring to late autumn you can find approximately 600 different plant species thriving in this garden, including endemic species. 4 The Great Soča Gorge

The picturesque Great Soča Gorge is the mightiest gorge the Soča River carved along its course. After rainy seasons the precipitous walls capture severalmetre-high water curtains and protect the emerald Soča River flowing strongly along the erosion pots. In the vicinity you can also find the magical Small Soča Gorge.

5 Šunik Water Grove

Just in front of the confluence with the Šunik Stream, the Lepenjica Stream hollowed up a deep gorge with magical overflowing waterfalls. There is a marked circular trail routed through the Šunik Water Grove where you can visit the remnants of the old mill and a former sawmill.

6 Lake Krn

The largest Slovenian high-altitude lake is a popular hiking destination because it is located beneath Mt. Krn at an altitude of 1,391 m. The ecosystem of this lake contains 40 different plant species, mostly algae, and 24 lower animal species, mostly small crayfish. Swimming in the lake is prohibited due to the preservation of the ecosystem. \mapsto Mountain hut in the Lepena Valley

7 Mangart Mountain Pass The highest-lying mountain road in Slovenia s routed through five tunnels carved nto solid rock and leads to an excellent wpoint. Mangart Mountain pass (2,055 m) epresents a splendid starting point for limbing tours to Mt. Mangart (2,679 m), a lestination for road cyclists and a take-off point for paragliding tandem flights.

8 Kluže Fortress and Fort Hermann The Kluže Fortress is most definitely one of the most picturesque fortresses in Slovenia. In 1882, it was built on an exceptional location above the Koritnica Gorge as a stronghold on the route to the Soča Valley. Nowadays, it serves as a museum and a stage for various cultural events. In 1897, Fort Hermann was built in order to serve as a

9 Kanin Mountain Range and the Prestrelienik Window

The unique high-altitude karst terrain of the Kanin Mountain range includes numerous natural phenomena. You can take the trip along the natural science educational trail, while the more demanding hikers can take a tour to one of the nearby summits. Prestreljenik Window is a very popular destination which can be accessed along a marked hiking trail or along the familyfriendly ferrata which is well secured and also appropriate for children over ten years of age. uring the winter the Kanin Mountain range urns into a high altitude ski slope.

10 Virje Waterfall

The Kanin Mountain range provides water for the Glijun Stream which is dammed just behind the magical karst source. The water that manages to pass around the dam flows through the gorge and later forms a fanshaped Virje Waterfall.

Boka Waterfall

Boka Waterfall is the mightiest waterfall in Slovenia. The view of the water falling 106 metres into the valley bellow is quite magnificent in late spring when up to 100 m³ of water per second flows into the valley due to the snow thawing high in the mountains. You can observe the waterfall from the road Bovec-Kobarid or from the viewpoint on the right bank of the Boka River, which you can reach along a marked trail.

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In the outlet mouth of the lower gorge of the Kozjak Stream, which springs high beneath Mt. Krnčica, you can find the stunningly beautiful 15-metre-high Kozjak Waterfall. Caught between the walls of some sort of an underground chamber it falls into a large greenish blue pool. There is a neatly arranged trail leading to the waterfall. → Parking lot for the Kozjak Waterfall 🔶 3,5 km 🕒 1 h 30 min

13 Kobarid Museum

This museum serves as a memory and a reminder of the events that took place on the Isonzo front during World War I. The museum pieces, large reliefs of the surrounding mountains, extensive photographic collection, reconstruction of a cavern and the documentary subtly narrate the story about the difficult and bloody period in the Soča Valley. The 12th Isonzo battle – The miracle of Kobarid - is especially highlighted because it is considered the most successful breakthrough operation of World War I.

14 Dairy Museum

The Od planine do Planike (From the Mountain Pasture to the Planika Kobarid Dairy) historic-ethnological exhibition presents the heritage of mountain pasture pastoralism and the development of cheese making in the Soča Valley. It is accompanied by a documentary about the traditional processing of milk into cheese and curd on the mountain pastures and about the production of milk products at the Planika Kobarid Dairy.



15 Kobarid Historical Trail This trail connects the key natural and historical sights of the Kobarid area: Kobarid Museum, Dairy Museum, Kozjak Waterfall, Italian Charnel House, Tonocov grad archaeological site, Soča Gorge and the Napoleon's Bridge across the Soča River. \mapsto Kobarid

You can find several small villages on the Veneto hills in the Breginjski kot Valley. The largest of them is the village of Breginj which was considered the pearl of the Veneto-Slovenian architecture until the earthquake of 1976. The complex of twostorey stone houses interconnected with balconies is a unique outdoor museum and the only preserved witness of the former appearance of Breginj. ➡ Parking lot in Breginj

17 Napoleon's Bridge

There is a graduated stone bridge from the 19th century spanning over the narrow canyon of the Nadiža River. It was built during the times of the French emperor Napoleon's conquests, hence its name. Due to its exceptional construction it is nowadays an indispensible architectural monument and an important link to the past. Underneath the bridge you can find one of the most popular summer bathing areas by the Nadiža River. → Parking lot at the Napoleon's bridge

18 Koseč Gorges

Near the village of Koseč the Brsnik Stream carved a wild 60-metre-deep gorge which is not completely accessible. There is an arranged circular trail leading past the Church of St. Just from the 14th century and along the waterfalls of the Stopnik Stream to the gorges of the Brsnik Stream and eventually past the energy points and above the gorges of the Ročica Stream.

19 Outdoor Museum Kolovrat The Kolovrat ridge, which offers luxurious views from the Julian Alps to the Adriatic Sea was one of the World War I battlefields. The former command and observation points, machine gun and artillery positions, caverns and a network of trenches are today arranged as an outdoor museum and a part of the Walk of Peace.

20 Tolmin Museum

The rich cultural heritage of the Soča Valley is concisely presented in the Tolmin Museum which is housed in the former Coronini Mansion. The permanent exhibition emphasizes the Iron-age St. Lucia culture from Most na Soči, presents the rich ethnological and architectural heritage, demonstrates mountain pasture pastoralism and cheese making tradition, and, among the historically important events, exposes the great Tolmin peasant uprising from 1713 and more important events from the 19th to the end of the 20th century.

21 Mt. Kozlov rob

This rounded hill above the town of Tolmin is a popular recreational point and an mportant cultural monument. The ruins you can notice on the top of the hill are the remnants of the once most important castle in the Tolmin area.

22 Tolmin Gorges

The wild gorges of the Tolminka and Zadlaščica rivers with the distinctive wedged rock resembling a bear's head are the lowest entry point into the Triglav National Park and an exceptional natural sight. The confluence of these rivers is the only confluence in a gorge you can find in Slovenia.

23 Javorca, the Memorial Church of the Holy Spirit

In the vicinity of the Polog Mountain pasture in a picturesque valley of the Tolminka River you can find the Church of the Holy Spirit – a magnificent monument of World War I. It is dedicated to the fallen Austro-Hungarian defenders of the Tolmin battlefield of the Isonzo front. The exterior of this wooden sanctuary is decorated with coats-of-arms of Austro-Hungarian regions, while inside the church you can find oak panels with burnt in names of the fallen heroes. In 2018, the church received the European Heritage Label → Parking lot beneath the church (during the main season P + R Tolmin)

24 German Ossuary

Just above the Soča River you can find an ossuary with the remains of the German soldiers fallen in the 12th Isonzo battle. The interior of the ossuary is divided into two parts. In the first part, the names of soldiers are carved into oak panels, while in the second part, the names of soldiers are written on the walls in a mosaic technique. Visits to the interior of the monument are possible upon advance reservation at the Tolmin Museum. In the vicinity you can find the confluence of rivers Soča and Tolminka.

25 Beri Waterfall

The Godiča Stream that flows from beneath Mt Tolminski Triglav forms a wonderful waterfall In the vicinity of Tolmin. You can reach it along a marked trail which is ideal if you would like to escape to the intact nature.

26 Lake Most na Soči

The colour of this idyllic accumulatior lake is the same as the colour of the Soča River, while the town next to it has plenty of stories to tell. You can find two arranged themed trails routed along the lake: the cultural-historical trail Čez Most po modrost and the energetic trail Na Most po krepkost. There are plenty of possibilities to spend your leisure time actively.

27 The Plečnik's Church

he medieval church was demolished and burnt and then restored in 1958 with the help of the renowned Slovenia architect Jože Plečnik who left his mark in the church. It stands on a small hill which offers splendid views of the surrounding hills. Visits to the interior of the church are possible upon advance reservation at the Tolmin Museum.


28 Kanal, the old town centre This attractive medieval town has a rich cultural heritage. Its distinctive mark is the renowned stone bridge across the Soča River. The oldest centre of the settlement of

Kanal is the stone Kontrada Square which was enclosed by walls during the medieval period. On the square you can find the Gothic House from the 11th century and the Fišč's House with a well-arranged memorial room of the painter and graphic designer Riko Debenjak and the Riko Debenjak gallery arranged in one of the preserved defence towers from the times of the Turkish sieges. In the old centre of the town you can also find the Neptune Fountain from 1815. 🛏 Kanal 🕒 1 h



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



town of Bovec, as the finest part of the Alpe Adria Trail.





The natural environment of this area includes numerous historical sights which provide visitors with an opportunity to get in touch with the past. **The Walk of Peace** from the Alps to the Adriatic connects rich cultural and natural heritage along the former Isonzo Front



and is arranged as a memory and a reminder of the events that took place during World War I. Numerous fortifications, caverns, trenches, remains and cemeteries are nowadays arranged as outdoor museums (Ravelnik, Čelo, Zaprikraj, Kolovrat, Mrzli vrh, Mengore, Prižnica and Vodice), while the numerous artefacts and stories from this war were collected and presented in museums and private museum collections. The most magnificent monuments along the Walk of Peace in the Soča Valley include the Kluže Fortress, Charnel Houses in Kobarid and Tolmin and the Memorial church in Javorca.

The train ride along the picturesque 100-yearold **Bohinj Railway** is a unique journey into the past. It is a journey across a wonderful countryside, across daring and ingenious bridges, viaducts and through numerous tunnels. Travellers can get off the train at Most na Soči where a so-called **St. Lucia culture**



was thriving in the Early Iron Age (800–400 B.C.). More than 100 years of archaeological excavations revealed thousands of graves and foundations of residential houses and crafts workshops.

The Soča Valley has always been preserving the mountain pasture, dairy and cheese-making heritage. The Bovec cheese (sheep milk) and Tolminc cheese (cow milk) with the Protected Designation of Origin are extremely appreciated amongst consumers. Tradition is being preserved in various inns and restaurants where they serve culinary specialities, such as *čompe in skuta*



(curd and potatoes), *frika* (potato cheese omelette), trout, *kobariški štruklji* (Kobarid dumplings) and *bovški krafi* (pies with dried pears and wallnuts). It is a special experience to visit the **Hiša Franko** restaurant where dishes are being prepared by the **globally renowned** Chef Ana Roš.

Gastronomic offer is complemented by various culinary events and festivals: Festival soške postrvi, Čomparska noč, Jestival, Frikafest.
